5 Books Kinokuniya Shinjuku Main Store

1 Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden

新宿御苑

This is a great garden consisting of three different types of gardens combined in a fine balance in the huge grounds. Completed in 1906 as a garden for the Imperial Household, it became open to the public in 1949. It is a nature-rich spot where you can enjoy seasonal beautiful flowers, such as cherry blossoms in spring, and autumn foliage in fall.

2 Shinjuku Chuo Park

新宿中央公園

Located in Nishi-Shinjuku with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Buildings, high-rise office buildings, and hotels, this park serves as an oasis in an urban area, attracting many people especially during the cherry blossom season. The park has a restaurant, cafe, and a terrace open to everyone for a rest.

3 Kansenen Park

甘泉園公園

With a long history dating back to the Edo period (1603-1868), this park started as *haiyokuji*, a chartered domain of the *daimyo* feudal lord. It is a *kaiyu-shiki* stroll garden, featuring a circular promenade around the ponds. Surrounded by lots of trees, this place is perfect for enjoying beautiful seasonal scenery.

1 Shinjuku Nakamura

2 Shinjuku Takano/Takano Fruit Parlor

3 Oiwake Dango Honpo

新宿道分だんご本舗

This long-established wagashi shop near the East Exit of Shinjuku Station offers all the *dango* rice dumplings and *daifuku* small round *mochi* rice cake stuffed with a sweet bean filling on the morning of each day, which are just delicious with a nice and smooth texture! In addition to the standard *mitarashi* *dango* and *matcha*, various unique wagashi items are offered. The cafe serves *dango* and other kinds of sweets.

Shinjuku, an area packed with famous Japanese restaurants

Shinjuku has many long-established Japanese restaurants too. Popular ones are "Tsunahachi" and "Funabashiya" for tempura and "Shimakin" in Kagurazaka for eel. If you like noodles, you can go to "Sangokuchin" for *udon* or "Daian" for hand-made *soba* noodles. If you are interested in authentic *Kyo-kaiseki* cuisine, you should try "Shinjuku Kakiden."

"LOVE" "LOVE" オブジェ

This is a world-famous statue in front of Shinjuku i-LAND Tower. Created by Robert Indiana, an American artist, this object d'art is a popular meeting place.

Large screens around Shinjuku Station 駅前大型ビジョン

The area around Shinjuku Station has several large screens. The famous one with the huge 3-D cat is called "Cross Shinjuku Vision" and it is located near the East Exit.

1 Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building Observation Decks

東京都庁展望室

Even in Shinjuku, which is crowded with numerous skyscrapers, these are one of the best observation spots. From the observatory on the 45th floor of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building No. 1, which is admission-free, you can enjoy a great view from 202 meters above ground.

2 TOKYU KABUKICHO TOWER

東急歌舞伎町タワー

Opened on April 14, 2023, this entertainment facility in Kabukicho has two hotels, a movie theater, a theater, a live music venue, and an entertainment food hall with the theme of "festival," attracting many visitors.

4 Hanazono Shrine

花園神社

Located close to Kabukicho, this shrine has been watching over Shinjuku since the mid-17th century. "The Otori Festival" (Shinjuku Tori no Ichi fair) is held in November every year. During the festival, in addition to food stalls, many stalls selling *kumade*, a good luck charm in the shape of a rake for business prosperity, are set up on the grounds, attracting many visitors.

5 Shinjuku Golden Gai

新宿ゴールデン街

A corner of Kabukicho crowded with about 300 small eating and drinking establishments. With many unique places, this area serves as one of the originating places of subculture and underground art in Tokyo.

6 Shinjuku Nishiguchi Omoide Yokocho (memories Alley)

新宿西口 思い出横丁

With a history of more than 70 years, this eating and drinking area has an impressive retro atmosphere. Lined with unique small izakaya places, the alley is always crowded with visitors.

7 Kagurazaka

神楽坂

This area has a sophisticated and nostalgic atmosphere. In addition to historic spots, such as Zenkokuji Temple and Akagi Shrine, there are many narrow stone-paved alleys throughout the area, which are lined with restaurants and drinking places with a calm atmosphere, making it a perfect place for strolling.

Best Places to Visit

1 Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building Observation Decks

東京都庁展望室

Even in Shinjuku, which is crowded with numerous skyscrapers, these are one of the best observation spots. From the observatory on the 45th floor of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building No. 1, which is admission-free, you can enjoy a great view from 202 meters above ground.

2 TOKYU KABUKICHO TOWER

A town with many sloped streets with atmosphere 風情ある坂のまち
 The area around Nakai/Ochiai area has many sloped paths, as it has eight slopes on the north side of Nakai Station numbered from one to eight, such as "Ichi no Saka" (Slope 1) and "Hachi no Saka" (Slope 8). This area consists of highlands and lowlands connected with hilly streets. When you walk around the area, you can see how each street has a different atmosphere with a different view, making the area unique and attractive.

Ochiai, a town of the dyeing industry 染のまち・落合
 Until around the 1950s, there were more than 300 dyeing-related manufacturers along the Myoshoji River and Kanda River, making the area one of the three biggest producers of dyeing along with Kyoto and Kanazawa. There are still dyeing shops here and there in the Ochiai/Nakai area. The area organizes an event called "Some no Komichi" (Fabric Dyeing Festival) in late February every year, offering a "River Gallery" in which long pieces of tanmono (kimono cloth) are draped on wires along the Myoshoji River.

The tallest skyscrapers in Tokyo 東京屈指の摩天楼
 The skyscraper buildings in the Nishi-Shinjuku area form one of the symbolic landscapes in Tokyo. While this area has many business people during daytime, it serves as a popular spot for adults enjoying a night view at restaurants and bars on higher floors in the evening.

Tram: Tokyo Sakura Tram (Toden Arakawa Line)
 路面電車・東京さくらトラム(都電荒川線)
 In Tokyo in the past, there used to be many tram lines called "toden" running throughout the city. Tokyo Sakura Tram (Toden Arakawa Line) is the only existing toden, running for 12.2 km. Taking time travel by toden may become one of your good memories from your trip!

Experience & Entertainment

1 Some no Sato OCHIAI
 染の里おちあい(二葉苑)
 Shinjuku still has several traditional dye shops, including this one with a history of over 100 years. This dye shop offers a hands-on program to dye your original table runner or bag.

2 Yari Nohgakudo
 矢来能楽堂
 Noh is one of the traditional forms of Japanese theater, which was established in the 14th century. It is a dance-based dramatic performance on a special Noh stage using masks and costumes. The Yari Nohgakudo is the only Noh theater in Shinjuku, located in Kagurazaka. It holds a regular performance on the 2nd Sunday of every month.

3 Suehirotei
 末廣亭
 Built in 1946, this yose theater is a place for performances of rakugo (traditional verbal entertainment) and manzai (Japanese version of stand-up comedy usually involving two performers) held on a regular basis. This quaint wooden building has tatami seats and chair seats. The programs and casts for the performances are changed every 10 days.

4 Ninja Trick House in Tokyo
 手裏剣道場 新宿忍者からくり屋敷
 This hands-on facility in Kabukicho offers an opportunity to try various kinds of ninja experience, making it a must-see spot for ninja fans. In this house filled with the vibes of Japan, you can enjoy shinken ninja stars throwing, kenjutsu sword fighting, karakuri mechanisms-hunting, and photo taking with ninjal!

5 Hanamichi Tokyo Kabukicho
 ハナミチ東京歌舞伎町
 This new facility is scheduled to be open in October 2023. It aims to deliver various types of information on Japanese culture emanating from Kabukicho. It will serve as a complex facility with different types of tenants, including tashu engeki (a genre of popular theater in Japan), kimono rental shop, Coffee Seibu Main Store, and various Japanese restaurants.

Gallery & Museum

1 JAPAN NATIONAL STADIUM
 国立競技場
 This served as one of the venues for the 2020 Summer Olympics and Paralympics. Incorporating elements of Japan's traditional architecture, this building using wooden materials gives a warm impression. A stadium tour is offered, which allows you to go inside and look around.

2 JAPAN OLYMPIC MUSEUM
 日本オリンピックミュージアム
 Located in the immediate vicinity of Japan National Stadium, this museum is a place where you can learn the history and significance of the Olympics through the exhibitions and videos. There is a corner where you can try to match the physical abilities of Olympians.

 Mondays (If Monday is a national/substitute holiday, the museum will close the following weekday), exhibition renewal period, New Year holidays

3 Sompō Museum of Art
 SOMPO美術館
 Located only five minutes on foot from the West Exit of Shinjuku Station, this museum is one of the art landmarks of Shinjuku. It has one of the six paintings of Sunflowers by Vincent van Gogh, which is exhibited in the permanent installation.

 Mondays (If Monday is a national/substitute holiday, the museum will open), exhibition renewal period, New Year holidays

4 The Waseda International House of Literature (The Haruki Murakami Library)
 早稲田大学国際文学館 (村上春樹777-1)
 Designed by Kengo Kuma, a renowned Japanese architect, this facility on the campus of Waseda University is serving as an international hub for literary study, based on the writings of Haruki Murakami, a world-class novelist. There is a cafe run by Waseda students.
 10:00AM-5:00PM
 * Please see the official website to confirm when WiFi will be open.

Meiji Jingu Gaien Garden 明治神宮外苑
 Centering around Meiji Memorial Picture Gallery with a history of nearly 100 years, various types of sport facilities, including Meiji Jingu Stadium, are located in this area. There is a famous street lined with gingko trees, which is often used for shooting movies and TV dramas, attracting many visitors with beautiful yellow leaves in fall.
