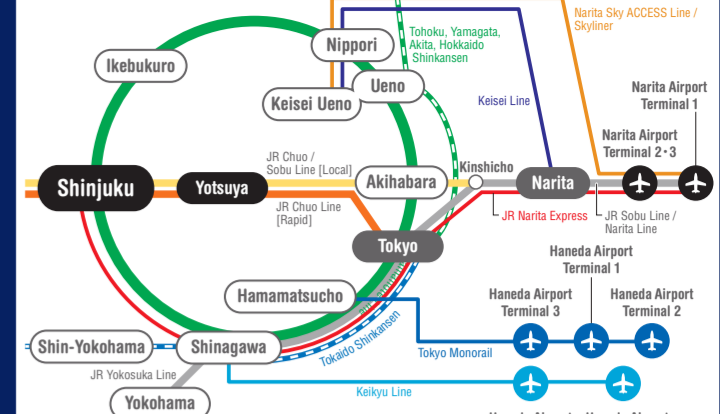

Best Places to Visit

1 Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building Observation Decks 東京都庁展望室

Even in Shinjuku, which is crowded with numerous skyscrapers, these are one of the best observation spots. From the observatory on the 45th floor of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building No. 1, which is admission-free, you can enjoy a great view from 202 meters above ground.

- South Observatory 9:30AM-10:00PM (Admission until 9:30PM)
- North Observatory 9:30AM- 5:30PM (Admission until 5:00PM)
- *When South Observatory is closed, open hours are 9:30AM-10:00PM (Admission until 9:30PM)

South Observatory is closed on the first and third Tuesday of every month
North Observatory is closed on the second and fourth Monday of every month
*When one of the steps listed above falls on a holiday, the observatory will be open on the holiday but closed the following day.
*The observatory will be closed during the New Year's holiday season and inspection days of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building.

2 TOKYU KABUKICHO TOWER 東急歌舞伎町タワー

Opened in 2023, this entertainment facility in Kabukicho has two hotels, a movie theater, a theater, a live music venue, a night club, and an entertainment food hall with the theme of "festival," attracting many visitors.

3 Kabukicho 歌舞伎町

As one of the biggest entertainment districts in Japan, Kabukicho has many restaurants, bars, theaters, movie theaters, and amusement arcades. The Godzilla Head, which appears on the top of the SHINJUKU TOHO BLDG. at the end of "Kabukicho Ichibangai," has become a symbol of the town.

*As of August 2024, access to the Godzilla Terrace is not allowed.

4 Hanazono Shrine 花園神社

Located close to Kabukicho, this shrine has been watching over Shinjuku since the mid-17th century. "The Otori Festival" (Shinjuku Tori no Ichi fair) is held in November every year. During the festival, in addition to food stalls, many stalls selling *kumade*, a good luck charm in the shape of a rake for business prosperity, are set up on the grounds, attracting many visitors.

Must see photo spots!

"LOVE" "LOVE"オブジェ
This is a world-famous statue in front of Shinjuku i-LAND Tower. Created by Robert Indiana, an American artist, this object d'art is a popular meeting place.

Large screens around Shinjuku Station 駅前大型ビジョン
The area around Shinjuku Station has several large screens. The famous one with the Shinjuku East Exit Cat is called "Cross Shinjuku Vision" and it is located near the East Exit.

5 Shinjuku Golden Gai 新宿ゴールデン街

A corner of Kabukicho crowded with about 300 small eating and drinking establishments. With many unique places, this area serves as one of the originating places of subculture and underground art in Tokyo.

6 Shinjuku Nishiguchi Omoide Yokocho (memories Alley) 新宿西口 思い出横丁

With a history of more than 70 years, this eating and drinking area has an impressive retro scene. Lined with unique izakayas and restaurants, the alley is always crowded with visitors.

7 Kagurazaka 神楽坂

This area has a sophisticated and nostalgic atmosphere. In addition to historic spots, such as Zenkokuji Temple and Akagi Shrine, there are many narrow stone-paved alleys throughout the area, which are lined with restaurants and drinking places with a calm atmosphere, making it a perfect place for strolling.

Gourmet

1 Shinjuku Nakamura 新宿中村屋

Famous for curry, Chinese dumplings, and confectionery, this venerable food manufacturer has a history of over 120 years. At Nakamura's own restaurant & cafe "Manna" in the Shinjuku Nakamura Building, you can enjoy various delicious dishes, including the perennially popular dish, "Pure Indian curry."

2 Shinjuku Takano/Takano Fruit Parlor 新宿高野本店・タカノフルーツパーラー

This popular parlor is run by a fruit shop carrying a variety of fresh fruits, and offers delicious, gorgeous-looking parfaits made with seasonal fruits. At the shop, you can find not only various fruits but also cakes and salads with fruits, as well as chocolates.

3 Oiwake Dango Honpo 新宿道分だんご本舗

This long-established dango rice flour dumplings shop near the East Exit of Shinjuku Station offers wagashi items including the dango and *daifuku* small round rice cake stuffed with a sweet bean filling on the morning of each day, which is just delicious with a nice and smooth texture! In addition to the standard *mitarashi* dango and *macha*, various unique wagashi are offered. The cafe serves dango and other kinds of sweets.

Shinjuku, an area packed with famous Japanese restaurants

Shinjuku has many long-established Japanese restaurants too. Popular ones are "Tsunahachi" and "Funabashiya" for tempura and "Shimakin" in Kagurazaka for eel. If you like noodles, you can go to "Sangokuchii" for udon or "Daian" for hand-made soba noodles. If you are interested in authentic Kyo-kaiseki cuisine, you should try "Shinjuku Kakiden."

Nature

1 Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden 新宿御苑

This is a great garden consisting of three different types of gardens combined in a fine balance in the huge grounds. Completed in 1906 as a garden for the Imperial Household, it became open to the public in 1949. It is a nature-rich spot where you can enjoy seasonal beautiful flowers, such as cherry blossoms in spring, and autumn foliage in fall.

* Drinking alcohol, smoking cigarettes and using sports equipment (except in the Kids Area) in the garden are prohibited.

2 Shinjuku Chuo Park 新宿中央公園

Located in Nishi-Shinjuku with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Buildings, high-rise office buildings, and hotels, this park serves as an oasis in an urban area, attracting many people especially during the cherry blossom season. The park has a restaurant, cafe, and a terrace open to everyone for a rest.

3 Kansen-en Park 甘泉園公園

With a long history dating back to the Edo period (1603-1868), this park started as *haiyochi*, a chartered domain of the *daimyo* feudal lord. It is a *kaiyu-shiki* stroll garden, featuring a circular promenade around the ponds. Surrounded by lots of trees, this place is perfect for enjoying beautiful seasonal scenery.

Shopping

1 LUMINE SHINJUKU 1-2 / LUMINE EST SHINJUKU / NEWoMan SHINJUKU

These are shopping facilities offering a large variety of fashion, cosmetics, and other general goods and items. As several stores are located near Shinjuku Station, they are good places to spend a relaxing time shopping and eating.

2 Isetan Shinjuku Store 伊勢丹 新宿店

This long-established department store with the impressive Art Deco-style building offers a wide selection of fashion items. In addition to the Main Building, there is the Men's Building, carrying men's fashion items exclusively. Don't forget to visit the food sections on the underground floors, where you can find all kinds of delicious food from Japan and around the world.

3 Takashimaya Times Square タカシマヤ タイムスクエア

Conveniently located a short walk from JR Shinjuku Station, this large-scale commercial facility has a large variety of tenants related to clothing, food, and living, from high-end fashion brand stores to "HANDS," which carrying attractive home improvement and lifestyle goods. The terrace on the 13th floor offers fine views.

4 Disney FLAGSHIP TOKYO ディズニーフラッグシップ東京

This is Disney store's flagship shop located on the Shinjuku-dori Ave. Once you step inside the store, you will find a space not only for shopping but also with lots of fun, with the interior which allows you to immerse yourself into the world of Disney along with photo spots with Disney art designs.

5 Books Kinokuniya Shinjuku Main Store 紀伊國屋書店 新宿本店

This is the flagship store of Books Kinokuniya and one of the largest bookstores in Japan. It deals with a large selection of products, including books, magazines, comic books, and DVDs, from the 1st to 8th floors. The building also has a theater.

6 BicCamera ビックカメラ

This large-scale home electronics mass retailer has three stores around Shinjuku Station, offering not only cameras and electronic goods but also sports gear and toys. You can also find SIM cards.

With the four UNIQLO stores around Shinjuku Station, the area is convenient for shopping. You can find original goods only available at the stores in the Shinjuku area.

8 SEKAIDO SHINJUKU MAIN STORE 世界堂 新宿本店

This is the main store of Japan's biggest specialty store chain carrying items such as stationery, painting materials, and frames. You can find a variety of high-quality Japanese stationery. If you are interested in unique stationery and/or art production, it is a must-visit place.

SKYHOP BUS
Same-day ticket: Adult 4,800 yen, Child 2,400 yen
On an open-top double-decker bus, you can freely get on and off at any designated bus stop to visit landmarks in Tokyo, mainly Shinjuku.

A town with many sloped streets with atmosphere
The area around Nakai/Ochiai area has many sloped paths, as it has eight slopes on the north side of Nakai Station numbered from one to eight.

Ochiai, a town of the dyeing industry
Until around the 1950s, there were more than 300 dyeing-related manufacturers along the Myoshoji River and Kanda River.

The tallest skyscrapers in Tokyo
The skyscraper buildings in the Nishi-Shinjuku area form one of the symbolic landscapes in Tokyo.

Experience & Entertainment

1 Some no Sato OCHIAI
染の里おちあい(二葉苑)
Shinjuku still has several traditional dye shops, including this one with a history of over 100 years.

2 Yarai Nohgakudo
矢来能楽堂
Noh is one of the traditional forms of Japanese theater, which was established in the 14th century.

3 Suehrotei
末廣亭
Built in 1946, this yose theater is a place for performances of rakugo (traditional verbal entertainment) and manza (Japanese version of stand-up comedy).

4 Ninja Trick House in Tokyo
手裏剣道場 新宿忍者からくり展覧
This hands-on facility in Kabukicho offers an opportunity to try various kinds of ninja experience.

5 Hanamichi Tokyo Kabukicho
ハナミチ東京歌舞伎町
This new facility is scheduled to be open in October 2023. It aims to deliver various types of information on Japanese culture.

Gallery & Museum

1 JAPAN NATIONAL STADIUM
国立競技場
This served as one of the venues for the 2020 Summer Olympics and Paralympics.

2 JAPAN OLYMPIC MUSEUM
日本オリンピックミュージアム
Located in the immediate vicinity of Japan National Stadium, this museum is a place where you can learn the history and significance of the Olympics.

3 Sompō Museum of Art
SOMPO美術館
Located only five minutes on foot from the West Exit of Shinjuku Station, this museum is one of the art landmarks of Shinjuku.

4 The Waseda International House of Literature
(The Haruki Murakami Library)
Designed by Kengo Kuma, a renowned Japanese architect, this facility on the campus of Waseda University is serving as an international hub for literary study.
